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A year to reflect...

2020 has been a trying year on so many fronts. With the outbreak of the covid pandemic, we have all taken pause to introspect on what is truly important. It has also exposed the importance of local governments to protect the most vulnerable. On numerous occasions we have received panicked calls from administrators for support. This has made us realize how important it is to support local governance and further gotten us driven about our work. Whether it was how to manage the migrants returning or how to get elderly food, we have worked on a diverse set of problem.

Over the past year, we have also reinvented much of our approaches and put in a lot more effort to build community response systems given how communities have become central to this discussion. This has means that we have increased our focus on partnerships for the Jaano app, a tool that provides public reviews of government institutions.

The pandemic showed us that broken public institutions, if ignored, can come back to have significant impact at a later date. Consider the local public health institutions for example, that have been broken for so long and there has been little effort to correct them. Now in the pandemic it has created a major crisis. It is important now, more than ever, that we fully realize and act promptly to fixing governance tools. If the government is our first social protection system, then we need to ensure that it remains strong!

We leverage research, data and a knowledge base of public service delivery to create the most impact. Swaniti has been working with state and local governments to strengthen those public programs. 



Implementing Change: A Hands-on Approach To Improving Last-Mile Public Service Delivery Mechanisms



The Andhra Pradesh Social Development Project

Swaniti's Andhra Pradesh Social Development project is aimed at improving the inclusion and access of the most vulnerable sections of the population in government programs through four core schemes: MGNREGS, Rythu Bharosa, IWMP and Unnat with the Department of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj. We strive to create a model state of Andhra Pradesh that has an inclusive and effective implementation process for government policies.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- **Working with Rural Development wing heads** to reduce leakages associated with rejected payments under MGNREGA
- **Carrying out a detailed study outlining discrepancies** between MGNREGA Social Audit and Vigilance Data
- **Coordinating development of dragon fruit plantation and mangrove plantation** plans supporting livelihoods for 2 lakh beneficiaries.
- **Conducting capacity building sessions** and contributing inputs to training programs under CFP (CLuster Facilitation Project) and UNNATI Projects.

SWANITI'S IMPACT

- **More than 2000 beneficiary and 800 government officials have been consulted** through FGDs and interviews.
- **The Department has accepted 15 recommendations proposed by Swaniti** under MGNREGS, Rythu Bharosa and IWMP.
- **The team aided the introduction of 6 new projects** under MGNREGS and IWMP.
- **Rejected payments have reduced from Rs. 9.95 crore in April 2020 to Rs 50 lakh** by February 2021 impacting 1 lakh people in the state.
- **Trained 200 field staff and government officers through 5 workshops** to aid skill development and strengthen grievance resolution mechanisms.



Ushering Change Through Green Jobs In Jharkhand

Swaniti Initiative has been working in Jharkhand since August 2020 with the dual aim of generating alternate livelihood opportunities in environmentally-friendly and non-polluting sectors to increase local farmers' income by introducing clean energy initiatives. For this purpose, the team is working alongside the Directorate of Employment and Training and the Directorate of Horticulture.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- The team **carried out extensive consultations with 50 private sector organisations** to map their apprehensions in their shift towards a green economy.
- **The Directorate of Employment and four green enterprises were brought to a common platform** to facilitate collaboration.
- **Recommendations were submitted to the Directorate of Employment** to create a "Green Labour Board" to facilitate employment opportunities.

SWANITI'S IMPACT

- Based on Swaniti's inputs the **Directorate of Horticulture confirmed the incorporation of solar dryers into the next budget** in the upcoming financial year.
- **Additional funds were mobilized** through the Directorate of Horticulture to conduct workshops on sustainable horticulture and develop standardised modules for further trainings.
- **18 District Horticulture Officers (DHOs) and 37 Scientists participated in a training workshop** which facilitated inputs being submitted to the department.



Encouraging Political Prioritization towards Clean Air

With the support of the Clean Air Fund (CAF), Swaniti Initiative has been working towards addressing policy gaps in the field of air quality management in Uttar Pradesh and New Delhi. With the aim of encouraging policymakers and administrators to streamline the planning and implementation process of air quality mitigation efforts, the team hopes to help kickstart policy-level changes in the two states.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- **Working with the Agra Smart City CEO** to create a high-level inter-departmental body that acts as a one-stop nodal agency for all permissions for works to be carried out in the city.
- **Carrying out a detailed budgetary analysis** to submit recommendations for better financial resource management
- **Documenting case studies** highlighting the importance of sustainable architecture, political prioritization and innovations in sustainable solid waste management.

SWANITI'S IMPACT


- **Submitted a study on** “Finding Sources of Financing Options for Clean air initiatives” to the Agra Smart City CEO, to help them identify sources of funding for interventions being proposed.
- **Carried out detailed stakeholder analysis** with 5 nodal departments in Agra to understand the challenges faced by authorities in implementing programs for air pollution mitigation.
- **Analysed NCAP plans submitted by the target cities and identified** areas where overlaps were occurring. Submitted recommendations to ease the overlaps and encourage effective functioning.



Strengthening the Social Security Net In Chhattisgarh

Chhattisgarh has one of the largest informal and unskilled workforce in India which was heavily impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and the consequent lockdown in the country. Since December 2020, Swaniti Initiative has been working in the state to provide technical support to the Government of Chhattisgarh to create **livelihood opportunities through the generation of green jobs**.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- 
- Consulting with the **Department of Labour, Chhattisgarh**, to create and maintain a credible database of labourers and their families.
 - Creating a **strategy plan for a comprehensive and robust single window clearance system** to support new green industries to be set up in the state.
 - **Conducting an in-depth survey of brick kiln workers** to understand their socio-economic conditions.

SWANITI'S IMPACT

- **Conducted a survey amongst 16,230 families** to create a database of informal workers and collect key information around migration patterns, access to social security benefits, skill sets, etc.
- **Aided the creation of an online portal to allow new green industries to register** themselves and gain access to automated grievance escalation mechanisms.
- **Supported the redesign of registration forms** by amalgamating requirements across four different labour codes to aid compliance.

Development Through Data & Technology In Andhra Pradesh

A key area of work for Swaniti Initiative is to integrate policymaking with data and technology tools that would strengthen the last-mile delivery for public services across the country. To that effect, the team launched a “development through data and technology” program to institutionalize a system within a pioneer state government that will reduce information gaps between citizens and governmental bodies through data collection and feedback with the help of the Jaano app.




KEY ACTIVITIES:

- A three day induction programme was **organised** for Associates who were trained on the various aspects of systems and processes of the Rural Development schemes with major focus on MGNREGA in the state.
- Post training the **Associates were deployed to four districts** -- Anantapur, Chittoor, Kurnool and Visakhapatnam -- to help streamline operations.
- **Awareness drives to improve visibility and encourage civic participation** were undertaken with key officials and village volunteers.

SWANITI'S IMPACT:

- **600+ MGNREGA workers and village volunteers were trained** in a period of 45 days.
- **Request for help by citizens increased from 28 in a month to 192** -- an increase of more than 550% due to the mobile application and visibility measures.
- **Almost 40% users were recurring and came back to address their problems** and help support their peers.
- **A 94% (182 out of 192) redressal rate was observed over a period of 45 days**, improving over an average wait time of 28 days.





Developing Basic Infrastructure in Jharkhand

The Swaniti Initiative team is working under the District Mineral Trust Foundation (DMFT) in 'High priority sectors' such as health, education, skill development and women and child welfare. The aim of this engagement is to (a) to minimize/mitigate the adverse impacts, during and after mining, on the environment, health and socio-economics of people in mining districts; and (b) to ensure long term sustainable livelihoods for the affected people in mining areas. Swaniti currently has Project Management units in 6 districts of Jharkhand: Deoghar, Pakur, Ramgarh, Chatra, Ranchi and Gooda.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- **Supported the district to invest in new and controlled ways of fish production** to cater to the needs of the market and generate employment.
- **Helped transform drinking water and sanitation facilities** in various healthcare centres and households through distribution pipelines.
- **Supported the transformation of Anganwadi Centers** into model Anganwadis that can be replicated across the district.

SWANITI'S IMPACT

- **13 schemes were taken up by the DWSD Department** through laying of pipelines and setting up filtration plants with the work providing **tap water facility to 47,954 households**.
- **Helped 35 Anganwadi centers get supply of essential items** including toys, utensils etc.
- **Helped ensure the provision of ID cards to each child** to ensure proper documentation in the district
- **Helped reduce the cost of safe drinking water** from INR 300/month to INR 62/month.




Collaborating With Policymakers Towards Effective & Efficient Systems and Processes



Fighting Forced Migration Across 11 States

Swaniti Initiative is the technical assistance partner for the India Working Group Against Trafficking (IWG), a network of 22 NGOs working across 11 states who are doing grassroots work to combat forced migration. Swaniti is working with IWG at a policy level to help them understand the ecosystem. Below is a glimpse of the work Swaniti has carried out this year.



Engaging with Gov't Stakeholders

- Initiated **engagements with key policy stakeholders** such as members of the Labour Standing Committee.
- **Facilitated 8 questions being asked in the Parliament's 2021 Budget session** on the issue of human trafficking.
- **Submitted recommendations on the Social Security code to two high-level officials in GOI**, the Additional Secretary, MOLE and the Joint Secretary, Social Sector, GOI.
- **Carried out online roundtable discussions with MPs** to discuss impact of COVID-19.

Building Capacity of IWG Members

- **Organised two consensus-building webinars** (October 2020 and December 2020) with IWG partners to discuss and decide on core policy objectives and list clear asks for all policy priorities.
- **Organised a 2-day workshop** on developing a combined SOP on Victim Compensation, to be submitted to NALSA and SALSA on behalf of IWG.
- **Surveyed all IWG partners to gather insights on the functioning of AHTUs in partner states** and the situation of human trafficking.
- **Supported strategic planning activities** for partner organisations.



Protecting Child Rights Across India



In 2017, Swaniti Initiative began its work with UNICEF India by launching a secretariat aimed at helping protect child rights across the country. The secretariat was responsible for supporting the Parliamentarians Group for Children, an association of Parliamentarians who have come together across party lines to raise support and advocate for child rights issues in the Indian Parliament.

KEY INITIATIVES



- **Capacity building of Parliamentarians** for creating improved and sustainable policies through **online Roundtable conferences** with section experts to aid Parliamentarians in carrying out conversations in light of COVID-19.
- **Creating a safe platform for cross-party discussions** on issues of children's rights at quarterly meetings.
- **Creation of a newsletter** to inform Parliamentarians of latests news and best practises in the realm of child rights.
- **Creating media engagement pieces** through videos and opinion pieces to highlight challenges and achievements.

SWANITI'S IMPACT

- On the occasion of the World Children's Day on November 20, **organised a virtual Climate Parliament with children, in the presence of Vice President M. Venkaiah Naidu, Minister for Women and Child Development Smriti Irani**, 25 MPs and over 150 children representing children's groups.
- **A total of 6 online discussions were carried out with 130 MPs** who were sensitized on the impact of pandemic on children.
- **Collaborated with 20 MPs to raise awareness on social media platforms** about COVID safety and child rights.

Creating economic opportunity



Swaniti Initiative collaborated on a project with UBER India, that looked to improve economic opportunities for its partners by streamlining formalisation through UBER. As a part of our analytical advocacy, Swaniti conducted primary and secondary research to assess the impact of UBER in employment generation, formalisation, and skill development within the gig economy through the lens of political representatives.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- In order to understand the importance of the gig economy and the impact of aggregators on employability and job creation, Swaniti worked to **conduct one-on-one conversations with Parliamentarians from tier-2 cities to strategise innovative part-time employment opportunities for young men and women.**
- Keeping in mind the effects of COVID-19 in India, multiple **closed door sessions were organised online via Zoom, which witnessed 35 MPs in attendance across party lines.** These sessions helped Parliamentarians better understand the gig economy, the potential of job creation through Uber, challenges for the labour market and the way forward.
- The **meetings resulted in a report** on best practises in designing effective policy interventions, protecting the interests of driver partners and aggregators and streamlining formal employment for UBER India.



Additional Technical Assistance Projects



Lancet Citizens Commission on Reimagining India's Health

Swaniti Initiative has collaborated with the Lancet Citizens' Commission on Reimagining India's Health and is working under Dr. Nachiket Mor to study the factors that can lead to the political prioritization of healthcare in India. Swaniti Initiative has been working towards providing analytical frameworks and is planning to conduct a primary research study with Parliamentarians to understand the scope of expanding universal healthcare in India.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- Swaniti Initiative has been instrumental in preparing **national and international case studies** to develop a framework in order to understand the occurrence and process of agenda-setting in healthcare
- As part of the study, researchers at Swaniti Initiative carried out **extensive interviews with academicians** across countries such as Turkey, Philippines, Brazil, and China.
- The Swaniti team has also prepared **mapped stakeholders and prepared a methodology for the primary study** to be undertaken with Parliamentarians.
- The research efforts of the team have culminated in **two draft research papers on political prioritization of healthcare**, namely - "Political economy of healthcare" and "International Political Prioritization of Healthcare"



Analysing The Economic Case For Renewable Energy Solutions

With the economic impacts of the current pandemic projected to be of historic proportions, the future of work is a source of major uncertainty, particularly in rural areas that have seen an influx of migrant workers. Swaniti Initiative supported the Association of Renewable Energy Agencies of States (AREAS), under the Ministry of New & Renewable Energy (MNRE), in assess proposals submitted by businesses who aimed to help agricultural and business productivity through decentralised renewable energy (DRE).



KEY ACTIVITIES

- Working with the Director of AREAs, the Swaniti team **conducted an analysis of 27 business proposals** using the growth-share frameworks to map 10 organisations that would receive funding from the association.
- **Created a financing model** that laid out a structure for the distribution of funds and management of finances for DRE powered livelihood applications in various rural areas of India, to be utilised by AREAS during its fund disbursement process.
- Wrote **a paper analysing** best practises in designing effective policy interventions to promote the use to decentralised renewable energy at the last mile.

Analysing measures taken to combat air pollution in New Delhi


Swaniti Initiative collaborated on a research project with the Delhi government to analyse important Orders passed by the various government bodies involved in pollution control activities in the National Capital Region. The aim of this activity was to identify gaps in implementation, understand the legislative actions various government bodies are taking to tackle the issue, and analyse the key challenges faced in implementation. Additionally, the team also compared various case studies and best practices to recommend models that can be implemented in the region.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- Created a brief **analysing the status of work being carried out in NCR** with an emphasis on the government agency/department responsible for executing the Orders, the timeline for such execution (if any), and the current status of execution (wherever such information is available).
- Carried out multiple **stakeholder conversations with experts in the field** to understand the scope of work being carried out, its effectiveness and gather inputs towards final policy recommendations.
- **Submitted recommendations** based on our analysis to the Delhi government as well as the World Resources Institute.



Looking Forward - The Year Ahead



While the past year has been incredible for Swaniti Initiative, we aim to further work towards the following:

> SCALING UP OUR WORK ACROSS MORE REGIONS

As the year progressed, Swaniti Initiative's presence in state governments has steadily grown. Our research work, coupled with our on-the-ground experience have prepared us to work with more state governments to implement projects and bring forward sustainable growth for multiple states and the nation as a whole. Additionally, we are also looking forward to expanding our international focus with projects set to launch in Bangladesh and Mauritius this year.


> WORKING TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT
